These callers may claim to be from, or representing, the Council. They may then ask you for your bank account details so that they can process the refund, but in reality you may find money leaving your account instead!

THE FUTURE OF ABBOTSBURY OLDER PERSONS HOME



Following an extensive consultation period on the future of Abbotsbury Older Persons Home in Mead End, Biggleswade, a report was considered by the Central Bedfordshire Council's Executive Committee on the 13th April 2021. At that meeting the Executive approved a recommendation that the home would close and its residents would transfer to alternative accommodation.

One of the significant factors that Members took into account in coming to this decision was the development of Mantles Court, a new care home nearby run by Quantum Care, and the offer to the Council of sufficient places for all the residents living in Abbotsbury to move there if they wish. Over the coming weeks the Council will be working with the residents of Abbotsbury, and their relatives, to understand their needs and preferences and to help them to choose a new home.

The actual closure date will be determined by the Director of Social Care, Health and Housing to allow the moves to be sensitively managed in line with the needs of the residents living in the home. For queries email Rebecca Carr at manop.programme@centralbedfordshire.gov.uk

BIGGLESWADE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

"Our vision for Biggleswade is that it should be a thriving large market town with individual shops, services and leisure offer in the town centre; retail and business parks to the south of the town and plenty of green spaces to enjoy the open air."

Over the past six weeks Biggleswade Rural Community Charities (BRCC), Biggleswade Good Neighbours' volunteers and the Biggleswade Community Group's newsletter team have between them produced, circulated and delivered flyers and posters around the town inviting people to complete a questionnaire based on the above vision, which itself is based on comments made at various public engagement sessions in 2019. Paper versions of the questionnaire were available on request and the feedback from the community is good.

The responses will now be collated by BRCC, and will help to inform a draft Neighbourhood Plan to be circulated in the autumn.

The opening of the new depot is in addition to the investment the Town Council is continuing to make in local parks and open spaces to improve the quality of life for residents. The pandemic has highlighted the health benefits of fresh air to people's wellbeing.

ATTENDING CHURCH SERVICES

BAPTIST CHURCH: If you wish to attend a Sunday service you will need to pre-book by phoning 01767 312667 or emailing office@bbchurch.org.uk Bookings open every Monday. Attendees will need to wear a face covering throughout and need to sign in and be shown to their seats. Singing by the congregation is still not yet permitted as per Government restrictions. The church livestreams their Sunday service on their Facebook page.

ST ANDREWS CHURCH: The church is open for public worship and communion each Thursday at 09.30 and Sunday at 10.00 preceded by a ZOOM service at 09.00. Masks should be worn if possible and social distancing with the avoidance of social interactions indoors is recommended. Booking is not generally required. Congregational singing inside church is not allowed but there are plans plan to re-start singing by the choir in accordance with national guidance.

ST PETER'S CATHOLIC CHURCH: For Sunday Masses (Saturday 6:30pm and Sunday 11am), please book by emailing ordering@st-peters.uk with your request. There are also weekday Masses on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays at 9:30am for which booking is not needed and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament at 7pm-8pm on Fridays (again, booking not needed).

TRINITY METHODIST CHURCH: will be reopening for public worship on Sunday May 30th at 10.30am (Trinity Sunday). They are not planning to run a booking system but space is limited so they are advising worshippers to arrive early to ensure that they get a seat.

Mantles Court is a 76 bed care home located in London Road, Biggleswade, and will provide long-term residential care and specialist dementia care, as well as respite breaks and convalescence. It will also create new employment including apprenticeships and development programmes for those looking to pursue a career in the care sector.

Quantum Care was formed in 1992 to operate care homes for the elderly in Hertfordshire. Originally Quantum Care took over homes that were previously operated by Hertfordshire County Council. In 2005 it opened a new home in Essex and another, Trefoil House in Luton in 2010. All homes have dementia units providing specialist care. Each home has at least one short stay room, which can be occupied by elderly guests from one night to a few weeks, allowing potential residents to see what the home is like.

The company were delighted last year when John Mantle, Chairman of the Mantles Group, gave consent to keeping the family name in the Town by calling the new home Mantles Court. The Mantles' family auto business had occupied that site since 1933..

Quantum Care is a not-for-profit organisation which means it does not have shareholders and therefore does not have to pay dividends. Its work is overseen by a voluntary board of directors.

Free rapid COVID-19 tests now available

If you are over 18 and don't have symptoms of coronavirus you can now get free rapid COVID-19 tests from your local community testing sites, local pharmacies or order test kits online at www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests. Soon they will be available from the Library. You are advised to first visit a rapid testing site to be shown how to do the test correctly. Our local site has been at Saxon Pool & Leisure Centre, but that closed on Friday April 30th.

A new centre is due to open in Biggleswade very shortly, and we will publish those details on our website at www.biggleswadecommunitynews.uk as soon as we can. Or phone us on 01767 448954. If you want to sign up for emailed editions of this newsletter you can do so via our website or by telephoning us.

If you have coronavirus symptoms you should not use this service but must get a PCR test as soon as possible if you have any of these symptoms: a high temperature; a new, continuous cough or a loss or change to sense of smell or taste. PCR tests can be booked via 119 or on line at www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test

Step 3 Covid restrictions may lift not before 17th May

No earlier than 17th May, the government will look to continue easing limits on seeing friends and family wherever possible, allowing people to decide on the appropriate level of risk for their circumstances.

- Most legal restrictions on meeting others outdoors will be lifted but gatherings of over 30 people will remain illegal.
- Indoors, the Rule of 6 or 2 households will still apply.
- Not before 17th May the government will update the advice on social distancing between friends and family, including hugging. Until then social distancing remains.
- Most businesses in all but the highest risk sectors will be able to reopen under COVID 19 guidance.
- Indoor hospitality will reopen - venues will not have to serve a substantial meal with alcoholic drinks; nor will there be a curfew. Customers will have to order, eat and drink while seated.
- Indoor entertainment venues e.g. cinemas, children's play areas as well as hotels, hostels and B&Bs will open, as will indoor adult group sports and exercise classes.
- The government will also allow some larger performances and sporting events in indoor venues with a capacity of 1,000 people or half-full (whichever is a lower number) and in outdoor venues with a capacity of 4,000 people or half-full (whichever is a lower number).
- In the largest outdoor seated venues, where crowds can be spread out, up to 10,000 people will be able to attend (or a quarter-full, whichever is lower).
- Up to 30 people will be able to attend weddings, receptions and wakes, as well as funerals. This limit will also apply to other types of significant life events including bar mitzvahs and christenings.

Before Step 4 (not before 21st June) begins, the government will complete a review of social distancing and other long-term measures that have been put in place to cut transmission.
