After nearly 2 years of lockdowns and isolation, for many in our community, this has been a time for thinking about our lives, family and community. No less so than at Biggleswade Community Group. Whilst we will never be a campaigning newsletter we can publish our readers' ideas and aspirations and try to support them in trying to achieve them by sharing them with our readers and ever increasing contacts.

BIGGLESWADE SPORTS CLUB will be holding their **Annual Cycle Meet** on the **9**th **July**, with a Jubilee theme. But they would also like to hold a Jubilee Children's Sports event if a Biggleswade venue could be found. Others wish for a **Bandstan**d at Franklin's Recreation Ground to be re-erected, and a **Town Band re-formed** and more use of the River Ivel. Where is that **Splash Park**? ERSOU confiscates millions from Bedfordshire criminals

Eastern Region Special Operations Unit's Serious Organised Crime Unit Officers and staff

use a range of specialist tactics and work closely alongside police forces and partner agencies to disrupt dangerous offenders operating across Bedfordshire, Cambridgeshire, Hertfordshire, Norfolk, Suffolk, Essex and Kent.

In 2021 police officers in Bedfordshire confiscated over £2m worth of Class A Drugs and almost £2 million in cash and assets from criminals, forfeited under civil powers as the Proceeds of Crime Act (POCA) legislation. Across Eastern Region Victims have also had more than £800,000 returned to them in compensation. In January 2022, 13 gang members, including 3 Luton men, were jailed for a combined total of 129 years for peddling Class A drugs across the country, which was the biggest ever jail term secured by ERSOU's Regional Organised Crime Unit. Created in 2010, ERSOU is funded by the seven police forces that make up the eastern region, with Bedfordshire Police being the lead force. It is made up of both police officers and staff from across the region. It has two main functions: Regional Organised Crime Unit (ROCU) and Counter Terrorism Policing (CTP).

COVID UPDATE



The NHS is setting up Nightingale surge hubs, temporary 100 bed structures across the country. For East of England this will be at Lister Hospital in Stevenage. Placing them in hospital grounds makes for more flexibility of staff

and equipment, with access to diagnostics and emergency care if required. The move comes as hospitals are currently using hotels, hospices and care homes to safely discharge as many people as possible.

COVID-19 UPDATE Cases of Omicron have reduced in our area but are still very high and may not yet fully reflect the effect of Christmas and going back to school and work. Central Bedfordshire has a high incidence of residents with booster jabs at 66% of the population compared England average of 59%, but there are still areas with lower takeup. **Covid Jabs are still offered at the Old Registry Office in London Road, and Lloyds and Jardines Chemists.**

There is now a service for those with **a phobia of needles**, who email <u>elt.tr-bedfordiapt@nhs.net</u> or ring 01234 880400 for more information.

Lateral flo testing kits are delivered to **libraries** if available and there is a reserved stock for key workers. The nearest three walk in centres are in Stevenage, Letchworth, and at the Council Offices in Chicksands. Patients can request to be given Astra Zeneca instead of the normal Pfizer or Moderna for boosters at these centres, but they must be booked. Boosters are now available for over 16s, First doses are available for children aged 5-11 who are clinically extremely vulnerable (CEV). Letters will be sent out via pupils' schools. Priority PCR testing kits have been sent out to the 500,000 CEV adult patients by the national NHS service, sometimes without the normal text or letter notice. It is to be used only by that person if they show symptoms or have a positive lateral flo test.

CEV adult patients are having difficulties booking their booster jabs 3 months after their 3rd jab, and this was a question to the Prime Minister at PMQs on 19th January who will look into this.

The rules and guidance have regarding masks and working from home and isolation periods have been changed. However we are still encouraged to be careful and take precautions for our own safety and that of others.
