

ENERGY BILLS REBATE FOR HOUSEHOLDS IN CENTRAL BEDFORDSHIRE



In February the Chancellor announced that all owners or tenants of property in Band A to D would receive a £150 'rebate' to help pay for significantly increased energy bills in 2022. These would be administered in the same way as used for collecting council tax. **YOUR COUNCIL TAX ANNUAL BILL HAS NOT BEEN**

REDUCED BY £150. Our Council will credit the bank account used to collect each household's Council Tax. The first households to receive this will be those paying by direct debit, AND THEN ONLY **ONCE THE FIRST PAYMENT FOR 2022/23 HAS BEEN COLLECTED**, usually during April. DO NOT CONTACT THE COUNCIL – THEY WILL CONTACT YOU.

The scheme finishes on 30th September 2022, by which time anyone eligible for this should have received it. If your rent includes energy bills paid for by your Landlord they will receive the rebate.

For those who do not pay by direct debit Central Bedfordshire Council will contact you to find out how it can be paid. **THE POLICE ARE ALREADY WARNING OF TELEPHONE SCAMS**, so please be sure that you never give your personal and bank details to anyone that you are not absolutely sure is genuine.

The Government has also released £155million to assist vulnerable households, or those on low income in the other Council tax bands. Details will be available shortly and we will publish them in a future newsletter. Each local Council may administer this slightly differently, but the above is what can be expected to happen for those households in Central Bedfordshire.

For vulnerable or low income households there is also the Warm Front discount, mentioned in a previous newsletter, administered through the larger energy companies, so you need to contact your energy supplier for more information.

In addition the Government is loaning each household the sum of £200. This will automatically reduce your annual energy bill for 2022, **BUT UNLIKE THE ABOVE IT IS NOT A GRANT AND WILL BE REPAID VIA ENERGY BILLS OVER THE NEXT 4 YEARS**, at zero interest. You don't have to do anything at all as this will be done automatically by the Government and the Energy companies.

As already stated, no household should need to contact their local Council or their energy supplier, but if you feel your household qualifies for either of the above, but does not receive it, we will endeavour to find out what you can do and let you know via this newsletter.

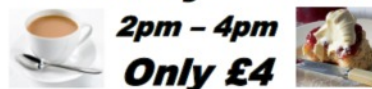

PERHAPS OUR LAST COVID UPDATE

Now that Central Bedfordshire Council are unable to report ward wide Covid figures, and with no more free testing, except for those on the clinically extremely vulnerable register, it has become harder to know how cases are running in our town. With yet another new strain which is more transmissible, it is now down to individuals to decide how best to live their lives.

Vaccinations are available at Biggleswade Hospital, Potton Road, SG18 0EL for all ages and can be booked on-line at the national booking service or by phoning 119. For those that are clinically extremely vulnerable it will be their 5th jab.

All parents of children aged 5 to 11 years are now offered the chance to have their child vaccinated with a lower dose of the vaccine. These can be booked as above. Parents will be given a dated card to keep safe and take along for the second dose which will be available in 8-12 weeks time.

Spring Boosters are now available for adults over 75 years, residents in care homes for older adults, and individuals aged 12 years and over who have a weakened immune system. The NHS will contact those who are eligible asking them to make an appointment.

Those on the clinically extremely vulnerable register should by now have received free lateral flow tests, and previously have received a PCR test kit to keep for if they test positive on a LFT test. Obtaining a positive PCR test should trigger a supply of anti viral drugs delivered to your home, to be taken as soon as possible to avoid serious illness. People in this group are still advised to take extra care when going out or meeting unfamiliar people. But we all now have to decide individually how we can best live with Covid.
