#### **NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN REFERENDUM RESULT**

Biggleswade residents voted to adopt the Biggleswade Neighbourhood Plan with 1857 votes for the Plan and 371 against with a turnout of 13.5%. The Neighbourhood Plan will now be adopted by Central Bedfordshire Council. Chairman of the Biggleswade Local Plan Strategy Group and Deputy Mayor of Biggleswade, Madeline Russell, commented "I am delighted that Biggleswade residents have welcomed the Plan. The Strategy Group has worked hard for over four years to create policies which will ensure that the best of Biggleswade is preserved as the town develops."

The Biggleswade Neighbourhood Plan now sits alongside the Local Plan prepared by Central Bedfordshire Council and the National Planning Policy Framework as a legal planning document. The policies within the Neighbourhood Plan will be



used to decide future planning applications for Biggleswade. Biggleswade Town Council wishes to thank everyone who voted.

#### FIRST INFORMATION FROM THE CENSUS 2021

The total population for England and Wales is now 59,597,300. Scotland has 5,466,000 people, Wales 3,169,586 and Northern Ireland 1,895,510.

Initial information recently released from the Census 2021 will come as no surprise to those of us living in Biggleswade. East of England is the fastest growing region, up 8.3%. Bedford Borough had the largest increase at 17.7%.

Nearer home in Central Bedfordshire its population has grown 15.7% up from 254,381 in 2011 to 294,200 last year. This compares to the England and Wales average increase of 6.3%. Being so rural a council area it is easy to forget that Central Bedfordshire's population exceeds that of Milton Keynes (up 15.3%) and Peterborough (up 17.5%)

A decade ago the population here was made up of 12.2% under 10s and 15.7% over 65s. This has now changed to 12.3% under 10s and 18% over 65s by 2021.

**Maythorn Children's Home** in The Baulk, Biggleswade has been rated 'Good' by Ofsted for the fifth year in a row. The home has achieved a 'good' rating in every inspection conducted since 2017.

During the inspection, carried out over two days in July, the home was rated 'good' across all three areas of inspection: the overall experiences and progress of

children and young people, how well children and young people are helped and protected, and the effectiveness of leaders and managers. The report highlighted how children at Maythorn continue to make significant progress with their independence skills, which will help them as they move into adulthood, as a result of "individualised and child centred" care plans – with staff putting the voice of each child at the centre of their work. It went on to praise staff saying that they "know the children well," and "work closely [with families] to ensure that children experience positive family time which helps children to retain their identity and supports their emotional wellbeing."

Inspectors also noted that "Parents are very positive about the quality of care the children receive. One parent said that the managers are 'absolutely fantastic' and that there are 'super people' working there."

#### LAND EAST OF BIGGLESWADE NOW UP FOR SALE

Outline planning permission has expired, and its owner, UK Regeneration, has now been put into receivership by its backers.

The 263 acre site, together with five other sites between Biggleswade and Sutton have now been put up for sale.

A major part of Central Bedfordshire Council's Local Plan, the new Garden Village would have included 12.5 acres for a primary school, 10 acres of leisure and community facilities and 150 acres of open space, allotments and a country park. Section 106 developer contributions would also have helped pay towards a new secondary school planned for a nearby site. It was the company's request to renegotiate the amount agreed towards the secondary school that caused the development to stall.

This has now impacted on Biggleswade's Schools for the Future, as both schools were a major part of the Council's plan to transfer local schools over to a 2 tier education system. Central Bedfordshire Council are now revisiting school provision in Biggleswade and its area.

In addition to the above site, The Grand Biggleswade Expo Corporation Ltd, also owned by UK Regeneration, purchased two major town centre pubs, the New Inn and Red Lion. Both developments were meant to enhance and strengthen the leisure sector within our town centre, but are also now up for sale.

#### **GRANT PALMER STEPS IN FOR NEW BUS SERVICE**

Flitwick-based bus operator Grant Palmer is to provide an alternative bus service for passengers from Biggleswade, Potton and Sandy from the end of October, following the news that Stagecoach is to withdraw its 72 and 73 services.

Grant Palmer will be providing a new commercial service, which will include:

• An hourly service between Sandy and Bedford (Monday-Saturday) with alternate journeys extended to either Potton or Biggleswade

 $\cdot$  An early morning service from Sandy to Bedford (previously provided by Stagecoach) is retained but journeys will finish earlier in the evenings

 $\cdot$  Journeys at convenient times for students travelling to and from Bedford College

 $\cdot$  A journey to and from Potton coinciding with start and finish times at Sandy Secondary School

 $\cdot$  Beeston is retaining its service, however, it will run on a reduced frequency (two hourly compared to hourly previously). Moggerhanger will be served on an hourly basis in both directions of travel

 $\cdot$  A direct service to Bedford from Drove Road area in Biggleswade retained (two-hourly)

Grant Palmer will continue to operate the 74 service between Biggleswade and Bedford via Ickwell and Northill on an hourly basis

for any passengers from Biggleswade requiring a faster and more direct service to Bedford.

Students who attend Stratton Upper School and currently using Stagecoach's 72 service will be transferred to the Herberts 189 route.
