ABOUT THE TOWN

Biggleswade Library closed on Saturday 24th December for a major refurbishment. It is planned to re-open in Summer 2023, with a co-located Children's Centre and Registrar's service. In addition, there has been an investment of new book stock for the library.

During the closure for refurbishment the following alternative services will be available:

- Library members can borrow and use the full range of library services, including computers and online reference services, from any Central Bedfordshire or Bedford Borough Library.
- From Monday 9 January, there will be a drop off and pick up point for library stock at the Saxon Centre, Biggleswade, during the centre's opening hours.
- Customers who have difficulty accessing an alternative library or the Saxon Centre may be eligible to use the Home Library Service on a temporary basis.

Customers may reserve items from any Central Bedfordshire or Bedford Borough library (no charge) for collection at Biggleswade Saxon library service point, or any library of their choice, either using the library app or through the Virtual Library Catalogue: <https://beds-arena.culturalservices.net/web/arena/> Customers without computer access may telephone: 0300 300 8055 to speak to staff at Sandy Library from week beginning 9th January, during the normal opening hours.

The staff look forward to welcoming customers back to the refurbished Biggleswade Library in the summer.

DROVE ROAD CEMETERY

Work has started on the restoration of the historic chapel in Drove Road Cemetery. Scaffolding was erected at the end of November for the first phase that is to be completed by the end of February. It is a listed building requiring expert workers and the project is expected to take three years.

CBC are installing a series of new bike repair stations for residents to use in different locations across Central Bedfordshire, as part of a suite of wider improvements to cycling infrastructure.

Working in partnership with bicycle storage solution company Turvec, the first round of installations has been completed.

Each repair station contains a stand to mount a bike on, an integrated multi-valve pump and a series of tools, such as screwdrivers, spanners, hex keys, and tyre levers. These allow cyclists to make minor repairs on the go, such as inflating flat tyres, replacing inner tubes, raising seat heights and other adjustments, and are also available for users of wheelchairs and prams to use, if needed.



A NEW ARTIFICIAL FOOTBALL PITCH

At last Biggleswade may get a new artificial football pitch this year. A planning application has been submitted to locate it at Stratton School with 5 a side and 7 a side options. It will be for school use until 5pm and for community use in the evening.



The saga continues! Biggleswade Town Council has written to Asda challenging the reduction from 2 hours parking. The response is very vague. They say that if you are shopping in Asda and need more time you can arrange it at customer services. But what if you are not? There are also reports of people parking there twice in the same day and getting a ticket with both periods added together.

Sandy and Biggleswade Children's Centre and Flitwick Children's Centre supported the Need Project

Staff from Sandy and Biggleswade Children's Centre, along with members of Flitwick Children's Centre, teamed up with the Need Project in the weeks running up to Christmas to pack Christmas parcels, which were made up of donations of food collected from local supermarkets, businesses, schools and community members and groups. Approximately 800 Christmas food parcels and 400 everyday essential food parcels were packed and delivered in the two weeks running up to Christmas.

Centre Manager Cathy Brighton and her team from Sandy and Biggleswade Children's Centre joined the Need project to deliver the parcels to families who are already known to and use the children's centre.

The Need Project is based in Stotfold with hubs in Sandy, Cranfield, Flitwick and Gamlingay and aims to support people in and around Central Bedfordshire who are facing financial hardship by providing food parcels. Find out more on their website.

CBC Support for families this winter



This month, we launched a £45,000 Crisis Fund to be administered through our children's centres, with vouchers available to primarily cover household bills and payments and support available to help families in emergency situations. Funding will be used to support families already known to the service, with health, housing, education and other partners able to refer families in need.

We have also set up a dedicated information hub on our website for anyone concerned about the cost of living. This includes information about funding for vulnerable residents to help with food, energy and water bills and other wider essentials and a network of warm spaces across Central Bedfordshire for people to use when the temperatures drop.
