#### **A LITTLE HELP**

#### Fire prevention needs you!



Bedfordshire Fire and Rescue Service (BFRS) does much more than just put out fires –and needs volunteers to help in fire prevention services that protect lives and properties.

There is a direct link between fuel and energy affordability and the risks from either not heating homes or heating them in unsafe ways and needed now more than ever are Fuel and Home Heating Advocates volunteers. They visit vulnerable people at home who are struggling with paying fuel bills, providing support to enable them to access the help that's available. The volunteer does the work of making calls and visiting relevant websites on behalf of anyone unable to access the internet.

Volunteers are also being recruited to the Home Fire Safety Visits team which provides home safety assessments and free installation of smoke and carbon monoxide alarms or specialist alarms for those with impaired hearing.

Additional volunteering opportunities with BFRS include Community Safety Advocates, Diversity and Inclusion Support and Community Events Assistant; to name just a few.



Volunteering is one of the most beneficial things we can do, for volunteers as well as recipients of services and these BFRS roles are particularly rewarding. All BFRS volunteers receive a tailored induction, relevant training, ongoing support and can claim travel expenses.

Grand Union Housing Group is developing Chamomile Gardens, in Biggleswade. The scheme will provide 25 shared ownership and 68 social rent apartments, exclusively for the

over 55s. The homes offer independent living with tailored care and support and benefit from being in close proximity to shops and the town centre.

It has been built to help people relax into retirement, with each apartment having its own private balcony or terrace. There are beautifully landscaped gardens, as well as a hairdressers, restaurant and even a cinema room.

They are also providing a "changing places" bathroom within the building, which members of the public will be able to use.

### Biggleswade Transport Interchange



Construction at Biggleswade Station started in August 2022 and and is ongoing. Other planned improvements include:

- accessible, step-free, access to all platforms
- improved secure cycle parking
- accessible toilets with baby change facility

The changes will make it easier for people to switch between different modes of transport and encourage people to use sustainable modes of travel.

The plans are the result of a Central Bedfordshire Council collaboration with Network Rail and Govia Thameslink Railway. They jointly funded this with Homes England's Housing Infrastructure Fund.
