Notes from the AGM on Thursday 18th May

Since our last AGM, we have received the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service (QAVS). Erica and I have attended a Buckingham Palace Garden Party as a result. If a volunteer would still like a QAVS badge or certificate, please let us know. We held our first coffee morning since the pandemic It was great to see people out and together again and we hope to do more in the future, and our first market stall with tombola. Another development is that we have partnered with Biggleswade Community Group on distribution of the Community Newsletter.

During each quarter of 2022 around 66 different volunteers helped 74 individual clients. This makes for a total of 1742 tasks for the year, which includes befriending (although this is under-recorded). Each one of those tasks has made a positive difference to two lives, as the volunteer feels better for helping a fellow human being in need.

We are looking for more volunteers who are able to be a phoneholder and / or provide lifts. Phoneholders play a vital role in Biggleswade and it is great way to connect with people. For existing volunteers, please consider joining one of our WhatsApp groups. These are dedicated to specific tasks and help us more efficiently match volunteers with tasks.

Thank you to every volunteer who has carried out any task this year. A particular thank you to the small group of phoneholders, without whom BGN couldn't function, Nichola (who organises our phone rota), our newsletter deliverers, the steering group, Gerri (who now does DBS checks for us), Jane (who collates phone befriending data), Eva (who reports on our activities for BRCC every three months), and of course, Lucy, who is stepping down as our secretary. We are also thankful for all of the funding we have received over the past year, both from the Town Council and donations.
