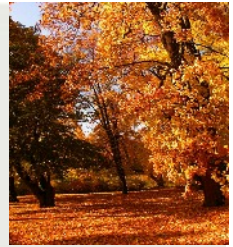

With the building work completed and painting and decorating coming to an end we are looking forward to a lot of activity taking place. The new library shelving and furniture will be installed. Once completed library staff will start returning the books back onto the shelves and getting the library ready to re-open to customers.

From Friday 29 September we will be ending the temporary library drop off and pick-up point from the Saxon Leisure Centre in Biggleswade. Until Biggleswade library re-opens library members can borrow and use the full range of library services, including computers and online reference services, from any Central Bedfordshire or Bedford Borough Library. Local libraries include Sandy (4 miles), Pottton (4 miles) and Shefford (7 miles).

A LITTLE HELP

World Mental Health Day on 10th October every year raises awareness of mental health, drive positive change and encourage discussion. This year the theme is 'Mental Health is a universal human right'.

Bedfordshire Rural Communities Charity, has a number of services to help those feeling isolated and alone or struggling with their mental health. If you feel you need one-to-one support, our Social Prescribing service can help. Our team of Community Wellbeing Champions help people take control of their health and wellbeing and help people to connect with their local community, improve physical activity, and empower them to make decisions to support their health.

We have a range of Green Social Prescribing activities and courses available that are free to attend and help people to spend time in nature and look after their wellbeing.

Our Community Agents make home visits to older people in towns and villages across Bedfordshire to provide free support and assistance. Our Good Neighbour scheme supports groups to provide a 'safety net' for their local area, responding to requests from residents in need of a bit of extra help. We also provide wellbeing walks which are free and open to all.
