Consultation opened: 6 December 2023. Consultation closes: 9 January 2024. Elected councillors will consider your feedback before setting a final budget in February 2024. In the meantime, the Council will continue to seek further savings. In March, each household will receive an information leaflet that will explain the details of what has been agreed and its implications for service users and council taxpayers.

The Bigg Loo Push

Biggleswade Neptune Cub Pack are doing a sponsored loo push along the pathway of Baden Powell Way on Saturday 3rd Feb at 10.00am. The toilet pans are being fixed to the seat of go karts, that were made by the cubs. The plan is that two karts will be made ready and that two leaders will sit on the loos and be pushed along the pathway.

The event is to raise money for a new set of toilets at the Mafambisa Care point in Africa. This care point provides 75 hot meals a day for the most vulnerable children in the community.

In 2022 the Cubs raised funds for a new shelter and they were very keen to help with this new project this year. The loo pans were donated by the new owner of the Miss Vietnam restaurant, whilst they were doing a re fit and Gill Clay, Baden Powell's Granddaughter, who has kept in touch with Nick Gurney Neptune Cub Leader since the naming of Baden Powell Way in 2015.

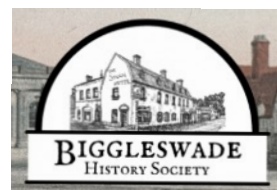
