# 2024 SPRING COVID VACCINE BOOSTER NOW AVAILABLE

If you are over 75 or are considered immune suppressed, you can now book your spring 2024 booster in the usual way, i.e. online or over the telephone. This time you will not be contacted by the NHS so it is up to you to book your appointment. You can "Google" online to learn more about being immune suppressed, or ring 119.

You can make an appointment at either Biggleswade Hospital, Potton Road, or at Biggleswade Pharmacy in the Market Square. Both have step free and wheelchair access.

Whilst having your spring vaccine around 6 months after your last dose is the usual timeframe, you can have it as soon as 3 months after a previous COVID-19 vaccine dose. If you are eligible, you can get protection from a spring COVID-19 vaccination even if you have not taken up an offer in the past. Most people do not need extra vaccinations to make up for any they have missed, but your doctor may advise a further dose if you have a severely weakened immune system.

It is important that everyone who is eligible takes up the offer this spring before the vaccination programme closes on 30 June 2024.

## New SEMH academy to be built in Biggleswade

The Department for Education (DfE) has approved a recommendation for Oak Bank School to run a yet-to-be-named new social, emotional and mental health (SEMH) needs academy, which will be built in Biggleswade.

**Saxon Pool and Leisure Centre** will benefit from a £101,116 investment to improve its energy efficiency. The funding is part of the Swimming Pool Support Fund which has invested £80 million into 442 swimming pools across the country since last year.
