A Little History: On 16 June 1785 a fire started at the Crown Inn and spread rapidly through neighbouring streets, destroying nearly one third of the town. A national appeal raised funds for 332 people who lost their homes and others who lost their livelihoods. The Great Fire is among the historical scenes shown in a Millennium stained-glass window in St Andrew's Church.


