From September to the end of April there are weekly meetings in The Sullivan Room, Weatherley Centre, Eagle Farm Road, Biggleswade SG18 8JH at 7:30 for an 8pm start until around 10pm and there is a bar! Activities include presentations of various aspects and genres of photography from visiting speakers including tuition on how to improve your own photographs, competitions judged by external impartial judges, social evenings and an opportunity for members to show their own photographic interests. In addition to the Thursday meetings there is a monthly outing to places of photographic interest, regular studio photography sessions, visits to interclub competitions, a monthly online critique session to help improve their photography, photo challenges and other social and photographic get-togethers.

A warm and friendly welcome awaits you, with help and advice freely given. Thanks to various recent grants we have the latest projection and studio lighting equipment. It doesn't matter what camera or cameraphone you have and you don't have to be an expert to join. Many of our members have started as beginners and gone on to achieve fantastic results and everyone can learn something from seeing the work of others.

The new season begins on Thursday 25th September with a Welcome Evening where you can find out a little more about the club, see a display of some of our prints and digital images watch some presentations and have a chat with members. There is no commitment to join at this stage. Just come along to two or three meetings as a visitor, free of charge, although there is a £3 charge when we have a visiting speaker.

A LITTLE HELP



Call 159 is a new initiative to support people who have fallen victim to a scam, or have been approached by fraudsters. If you are asked to move your money away from your account or feel pressurised into making a payment, STOP! Think, 'fraud?' Call 159.

This line is not for general banking enquiries. To stop fraudsters monitoring your call history, try to call 159 from a different device you may have communicated on with them. When you call you'll be connected to a system which will redirect you to your bank. The sooner you report fraud, the sooner your bank can take the right action for you.

Important: remember, 159 will never call you. If you receive a call from 159, or someone posing as a representative from this service—it is a scam.
