THE MARCH HARE DUNTON



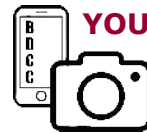

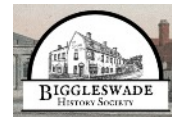
YOUR LOCAL CAMERA CLUB

Meetings at the Weatherley Centre have paused for our summer break, but we will still be meeting up for other photographic events. Weekly meetings will resume on 24 September with our Welcome Evening which will introduce the club to prospective new members and have a couple of short presentations by members and a display of digital images and prints.

This season the club has had some successes in interclub competitions winning the interclub battle with Ampthill & Bedford and with Kempston & Stevenage and came third in the much larger Bedfordshire Invitation Competition. Club members have had images accepted into national and international exhibitions and just recently three prints and seven digital images were accepted into the East Anglian Federation Annual Exhibition (open to 93 local clubs) which takes place between 2 and 17 May at the Apex Centre in Bury St Edmunds. Over the summer we are looking forward to a Studio Group session, Photo Walkabout - where we meet at a location and have an hour to take images on six subjects, revealed on arrival, and monthly outings to photographic locations.

The club continues to have images displayed in Cafe Mocha and will have an exhibition of prints at the Greenacre Centre, Stotfold from 17 July until 4 September.

"THE RISE, FALL & RISE AGAIN OF THE CARDINGTON AIRSHIPS"
David Fowler will present his illustrated talk about the fantastic history of Cardington Hangars & its airships including the R100 & R101 through two World Wars up to more recent times & the rise & fall of the Airlander.
