

Have Your Say:

Help improve support for victims of crime in Bedfordshire

Have you been affected by crime or antisocial behaviour in the last three years? The Bedfordshire Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC), John Tizard, is inviting residents to share their experiences as part of a review of services and support available to victims across the county.

The survey is open to anyone affected by crime or antisocial behaviour, whether or not they reported the incident to the police. Feedback will help identify what is working well, where improvements are needed, and how support for victims can be strengthened.

It takes around 10 to 15 minutes to complete, and all responses are anonymous and confidential. Information provided will not be shared in a way that could identify participants and will not affect any current, ongoing or closed investigations or support services. It closes on 17 August.

Have you been affected by crime or anti-social behaviour in Bedfordshire in the last three years? If so, please take a few minutes to share your experience. Your voice could help improve support for victims.

FROM GRASSROOTS RESCUE TO REGIONAL LIFELINE: THE REMARKABLE JOURNEY OF THE IVEL SPRINTER COMMUNITY BUS

When rural isolation and commercial transport cuts impact local communities, one voluntary transport provider is celebrating over three decades of service. The Ivel Sprinter is a blueprint for community-led infrastructure. As a non-profit organisation it has evolved from a single-vehicle emergency transport link to a multi-route regional network operating six days a week.

It started in 1991, in response to requests from rural villagers left without any satisfactory local transport. Demonstrating community spirit, local businesses and civic organisations rallied to raise the funds to purchase a minibus.

Driven by volunteers it facilitated trips to doctors, shops, libraries and market towns. The continued success of the charity relies entirely on its unpaid team. Highlighting this lifelong dedication, two of the founder members remained active until recently. Over the years, the original framework has been expanded. Supported by Central Bedfordshire Council plus donations from local businesses, the Ivel Sprinter now operates a modernised fleet.

Today, the Ivel Sprinter operates a flexible 'hail-and-ride' policy within an approximate 20-mile radius of Biggleswade and Sandy. Scheduled timetables run Monday through Saturday, connecting residents across Biggleswade, Langford, Sandy, Potton, Everton, Tempsford, Roxton, and Sutton to major regional hubs including Bedford, St Neots, and Cambridge.

The service is for all ages, and standard concessionary bus passes are accepted. In addition to scheduled timetables, the vehicles remain available for private hire by local clubs, charities, and schools. To sustain this vital asset and support underutilised weekly routes, the organisation is issuing an open invitation for new volunteers. Rota commitments are highly flexible, requiring as little as one drive per month.

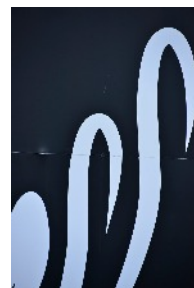

Meetings at The Weatherley Centre have paused until 24 September when we will have Welcome Evening to introduce the club to prospective new members

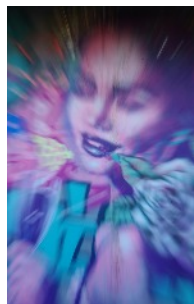
We still meet up for other photographic events. The July photography visit was to Charlecote House and Park in Warwickshire.
